Language:

You must securely know...

- The mark allocations for each question
- The **timings** you need to spend on each question
- The **skills** required and assessed for each question
- The **question stems** for each question
- The **top tips** you've been given in order to answer these effectively

Literature:

For each text, you must securely know:

- Plot, key events and key scenes
- Social / historical context
- Characters and relationships
- Themes
- Key quotations
- How to closely analyse language
- How to produce effective exam responses
