## Plot of the movies




## Costumes and makeup


Dynamics and Movements

Bollywood dancing is based off classical dances such as: Bharatanatayam and Kathak. There are hand gestures which come from these ancient forms, that are used in Bollywood dancing. For head movements, in slow moves, females tut their head side to side. This is attami (a certain head movement) from Bharatanatyam.

The dancer's hands don't generally move sharply, they move smoothly, even if it's an energetic song. The performers make intricate hand gestures to make the piece look more beautiful and inquisitive. These hand gestures are called mudras.

## Relationships

There is an equal ratio of males to females when dancing. There is a main female dancer and male dancer. This is the hero and heroine. They will most probably have a dance battle. It is a very happy time, and everyone is dancing. When the guys are dancing, the ladies would seem to look bored of their dance, and same with males.
