Structure of the College Day: Update September 2022 - July 2023

The government set an expectation that all schools should have a minimum of 32.5 hours in a school week. Therefore, from September 2022 the school day will start 10 minutes earlier at 8:30am and finish at 3pm. All school days will have the same timings and structure. School Uniform:

A reminder that when we return in September all students should be wearing Winter Uniform **ONLY**. This is listed below:

- Black Blazer with college logo
- White shirt
- College Tie or Prefect Tie if you are in year 11 and a prefect.
- Straight black trousers (stretch styles or jeans are not allowed).
- Black Knee Length skirt (Stretch styles are not allowed)
- All black shoes/trainers
- Black/Grey/White socks
- Plain black/tan tights
- Optional items to be worn with the college blazer (Not instead of)
- Black v neck jumper with college logo
- Black v neck cardigan with college logo

Please note that jewellery in any piercing is not permitted with the exception of a pair of stud earrings in the ears. Nose Stud's are not permitted. Make up is not allowed in years 7,8 & 9. In Years 10 & 11 it can be worn if discreet. Nail Varnish/False nails are not permitted. Eyelash extensions are not permitted. Hairstyles should not be below a grade 1 and any extreme styles or fashion statements that the college deems to be unreasonable will not be permitted. Please also note that hoodies and mobile phones are not allowed in school.

Tutors are rewarding students weekly with house points for wearing the correct uniform but equally wearing the uniform in the correct manner: shirt tucked in, length of skirts, black shoes/ black sports footwear.... It would be a real shame if your child was missing on house points for a uniform issue! Repeated issues with uniform will then be sanctioned with behaviour points in the first instance followed by phone calls home. Please contact the pastoral team / your child's Progress Leader in September if you are not clear about our St George's uniform high expectations.

Medicine:

Please remember that any medicine your child needs to take during the day, whether it is a one -off occasion or regularly must be handed in to our nurse, Terri Chappell. This is a crucial safety and safeguarding issue. Best practice would be for parents to ring our nurse before sending the student with medicine to school.

2nd Hand Uniform Shop:

Since being launched our 2nd hand uniform shop has been hugely successful. Please can I make a plea for more stock. Specifically, if you have any college blazers, branded PE Shirts, College Jumpers, White Polo Shirt with the College Logo or Tie's we would be grateful to receive them.
