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## Curriculum

## - Key Stage 3 (years 7 \& 8) - Accelerated

- Broad and balanced range of subjects
- English, Maths, Science, RE, History, Geography, French/Spanish, Art, Technology, Dance, Drama, Music, Computer Science and PE
- Key Stage 4 (years 9, 10 \& 11) - Enhanced
- All pupils study:
- English literature
- English language
- Maths
- Combined Science (double award)
- RE
- Core PE
. 4 guided option choices in year 9 , reduced to three in years $10 \& 11$


## What are GCSE courses like?

- All GCSEs are linear courses (no module exams)
- Assessment is mainly by exam
- Non-examination assessment (coursework) has been removed from almost all subjects (full details for each course in the options information booklet sent home)
- Numerical grading 9-1
- Grade 4 = Standard Pass
- Grade 5 = Strong Pass
- Reduced tiers - remain only in Maths, Science and Languages (all papers must be the same tier for each subject)


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## Vocational Courses

Saint George offers both academic and vocational courses
Suitable for pupils who prefer fewer exams. They are assessed through coursework and are at the same level as GCSEs

BTEC Level 2 Technical Award - Digital Information Technology
BTEC Level 2 Technical Award - Sport
BTEC Level 2 Technical Award - Business Enterprise
BTEC Level 2 Technical Award - Health \& Social Care WJEC Vocational Technical Award - Performing Arts (Drama)

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## Better grades leads to more choice

- Your grades at GCSE do affect the options open to you. They are important and the stronger your grades, the more options you have



## THE IMPORTANCE OF GCSEs

> Medicine requires very good GCSEs in Maths, English \& Science

Psychology requires a 5/6 in Maths \& sometimes a $5 / 6$ in Science

Teacher Training requires a min. of $4 / 5$ in Maths, English \& Science

Most look for at least a grade 4/5 in English and Maths

Competitive universities can ask for much higher GCSE grades!

Your results can determine not only where you go on but also the subjects which you can take!

## Our strategy: Accelerate, the enhance

- An accelerated curriculum means students will have completed the KS3 National Curriculum by the end of Year 8
- In years 9-11 students follow an enhanced Key Stage 4 curriculum using the additional time to have a broader and deeper experience within those subjects the students continue to study
- Double options process, guided by the school, means students can refine options over a longer time period - avoids narrowing curriculum early and ensures students are on courses where they are most likely to succeed


## Key Stage 4 curriculum time

## - Year 9:

- Increased number of periods for English, Maths and Science to 7 periods per fortnight
- Four core PE lessons per fortnight
- Five RE lessons per fortnight

| RE 5 Periods | PE 4 Periods | English 7 Periods | Maths 7 Periods | Science 7 Periods |
| :--- | :--- | :--- | :--- | :--- |

- Start four Guided Option subjects - 5 lessons each over two weeks


## Key Stage 4 curriculum time

- Year 10 \& 11:
- Increased number of periods for English, Maths and Science
- Reduce core PE lessons
- Reduce Guided Options from four subjects to three, and increase lessons for each remaining option subject

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## Options Pathways

- EBacc Pathway
- Two of your choices have to be:
- French or Spanish (whichever you are currently studying)
- History or Geography ( you can do both)
- Two further options of your own choice
- Core Pathway
- One of your choices has to be:
- History or Geography or French or Spanish
- Three further options of your own choice
- Foundation Pathway
- One of your choices has to be:
- History or Geography or French or Spanish

- Where a vocational route is available for a subject you need to take that rather than GCSE


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## Guided Options Process - Year 8

- Currently: Curriculum information presentation
- On website for parents and pupils
- Options Information booklets posted home
- $17^{\text {th }}$ October: Options Assembly
- Heard from each Head of Department about the courses on offer
- $19^{\text {th }}$ October: Curriculum Information Evening (6pm)
- Opportunity for pupils and parents to speak to Heads of Department and have any questions answered
- w/c $30^{\text {th }}$ October: First indication poll
- Mr Douglas or Mr Habberley will speak to each pupil individually and see what your current choices are, based on which pathway you have been assigned to
- $14^{\text {th }}$ December: Mentoring Day
- Appointment to see member of SLT after tutor to discuss options and agree four choices
- June 2024: Confirm final option allocations
