

Year 10 Geography Homework

"Geography allows us to see the world more clearly"

Within year 10 all pupils build on their knowledge and skills learnt within KS3.

With GCSE content, we strongly recommend all pupils to be revising independently at home each week, making revision tools that will be helpful to them towards the end of the course.

Homework alternates each week, and each class teacher will normally set an exam style question/s one week and then revision task the next.

Examples of the Homework tasks your child may be asked to complete are:

Prepare

Researching for the next lesson key concepts

Researching key terms or concepts

Reading newspaper articles or text extracts before a lesson

Consolidate

Annotating model answers to improve/highlight strengths

Exam questions on the weeks' content

Completing worksheets and/or exam questions on the content

Revision (creating notes/mindmaps)

Deepen

Reading text extracts

Speculating and explaining how one topic is connected to another

They will study the following topics this term:

- Economic Development (How the world's development is not equal)
- Nigeria – Case Study unit of an NEE
- Ecosystems

Every pupil will need to check with their class teacher as to what their homework task is, and the due date.

What else could my child be doing?

We recommend ALL pupils to:

- Practice using OS maps - looking for locations, following the route that has been walked/driven and/or giving 4 and 6 figure grid references.
- Practice measuring distances on a map (straight as the crow flies and also curved).
- To use a compass where possible, and be confident using compass directions.
- To read the news and keep up to date with current affairs.
