

Year 11 Geography Homework

“Geography prepares for the world of work - Geographers with their high level skills and employability”

Within year 11 all pupils build on their knowledge and skills learnt within KS3.

With GCSE content, we strongly recommend all pupils to be revising independently at home each week, making revision tools that will be helpful to them towards the end of the course.

Homework alternates each week, and each class teacher will normally set an exam style question/s one week and then revision task the next.

Examples of the Homework tasks your child may be asked to complete are:

Prepare

Researching for the next lesson key concepts

Consolidate

Annotating model answers to improve/highlight strengths

Exam questions on the weeks' content

Completing worksheets and/or exam questions on the content e.g. Thanet Earth

Revision (creating notes/mindmaps)

Deepen

Reading text extracts

Additional reading around resource management

They will study the following topics this term:

- Resource Management – Focus on Food
- Pre-release material for the Mock Exam (Paper 3)
- The pre-release material

PLEASE NOTE

The pre-release material will be released at the end of March and all pupils will be given tasks to complete and prepare them over Easter. There will be further lessons on this before the GCSE

exams begin. It is vital for paper 3 that pupils complete as much of this work prior to the lessons and exam, to maximise their marks and potential.

Every pupil will need to check with their class teacher as to what their homework task is, and the due date.

What else could my child be doing?

We recommend ALL pupils to:

- Practice using OS maps - looking for locations, following the route that has been walked/driven and/or giving 4 and 6 figure grid references.
- Practice measuring distances on a map (straight as the crow flies and also curved).
- To use a compass where possible, and be confident using compass directions.
- To read the news and keep up to date with current affairs.
