Homework for Religious Studies GCSE

Class teachers decide what homework tasks are to be set for a particular class. Below is a list of example homework tasks that your child may be given.

Prepare	Consolidate	Deepen
Watch a video clip and make some notes.	Learn definitions of key words.	Visit a place of worship.
Read a bible passage and be ready to discuss it in the next lesson.	Complete practise examination questions.	Interview people of different religious traditions about the same topic and analyse the difference in religious practise.
Prepare a presentation on an upcoming topic to share with the rest of the class.	Revise for end of topic tests.	Watch the news and link topics in the course to world events. Think about how religious teaching could apply to this issue.
Investigate the upcoming topic and find out a number of interesting facts about it.	Watch Mr McMillan videos on YouTube.	Discuss topics studied in lessons at home, making sure that you look at things from different perspectives. Topics could include abortion, euthanasia, war, justice, etc.
Purchase a revision book and read the next topic to be done in class. Note down any questions that you have and then ask your teacher.	Use the Kerboodle text book to make revision cards and posters.	Look at the Catechism or other church documents to find out what they say about the topic studied in class.
