Discover the World of 3D Design and Innovation!

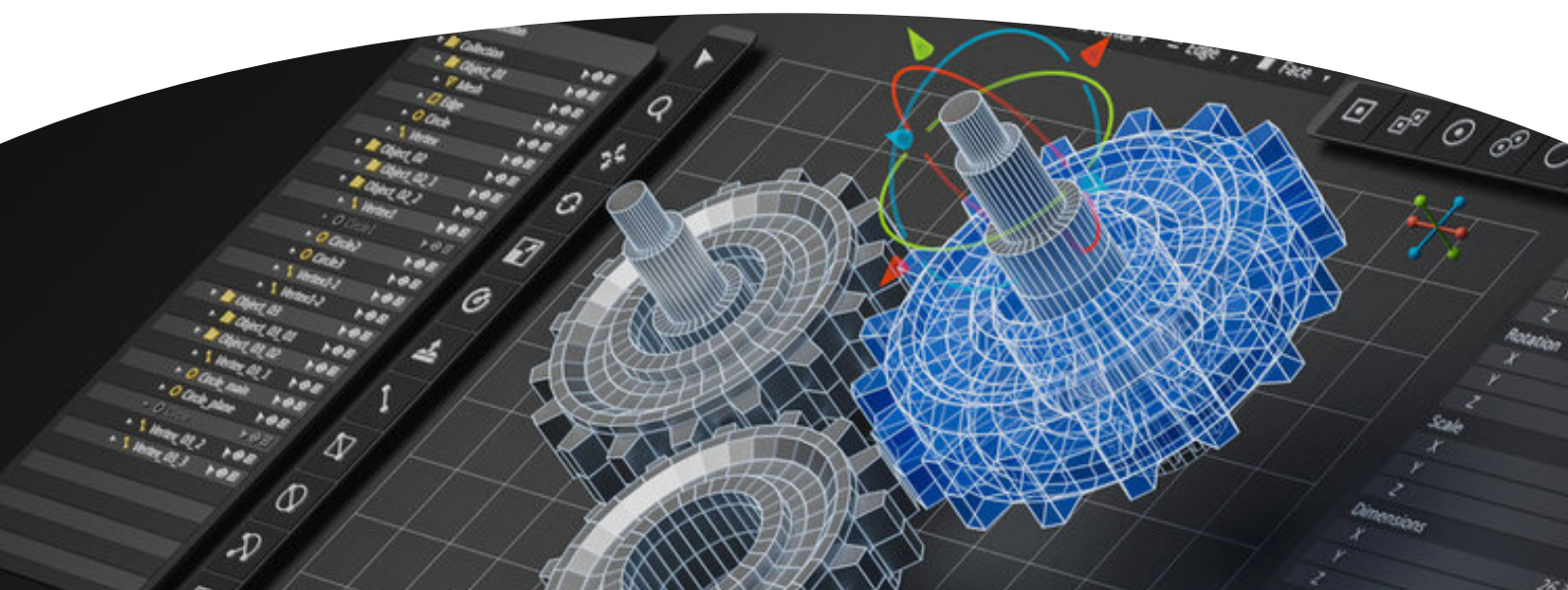

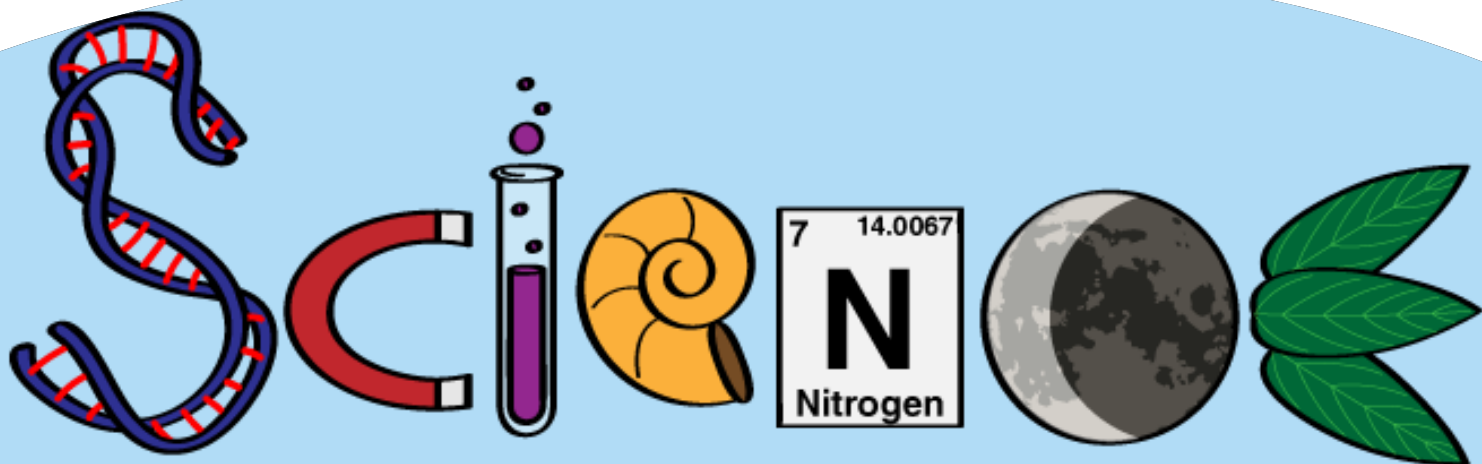
Whatever takes your fancy, this is an opportunity to learn about the science happening around us that isn't taught in lessons. Why not come and spend a lunchtime in the Science department.

For all those who are interested in how the past has shaped our world today.

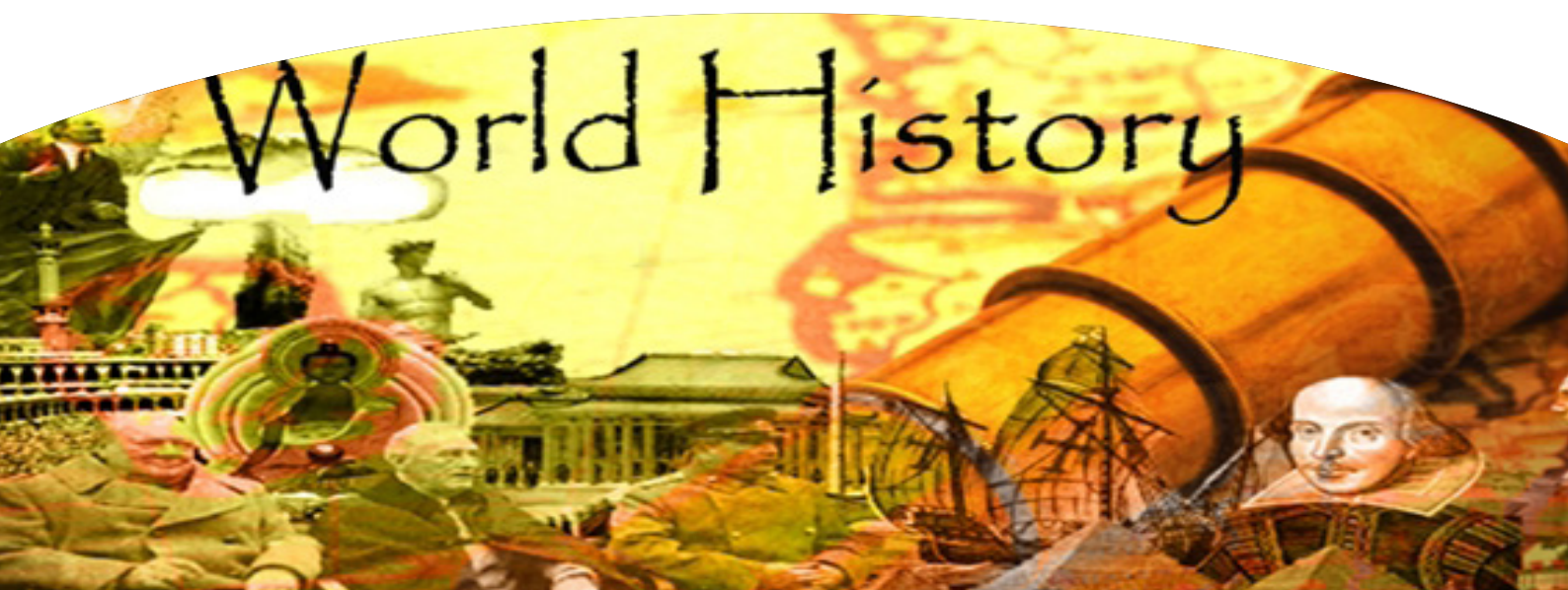

What is it?

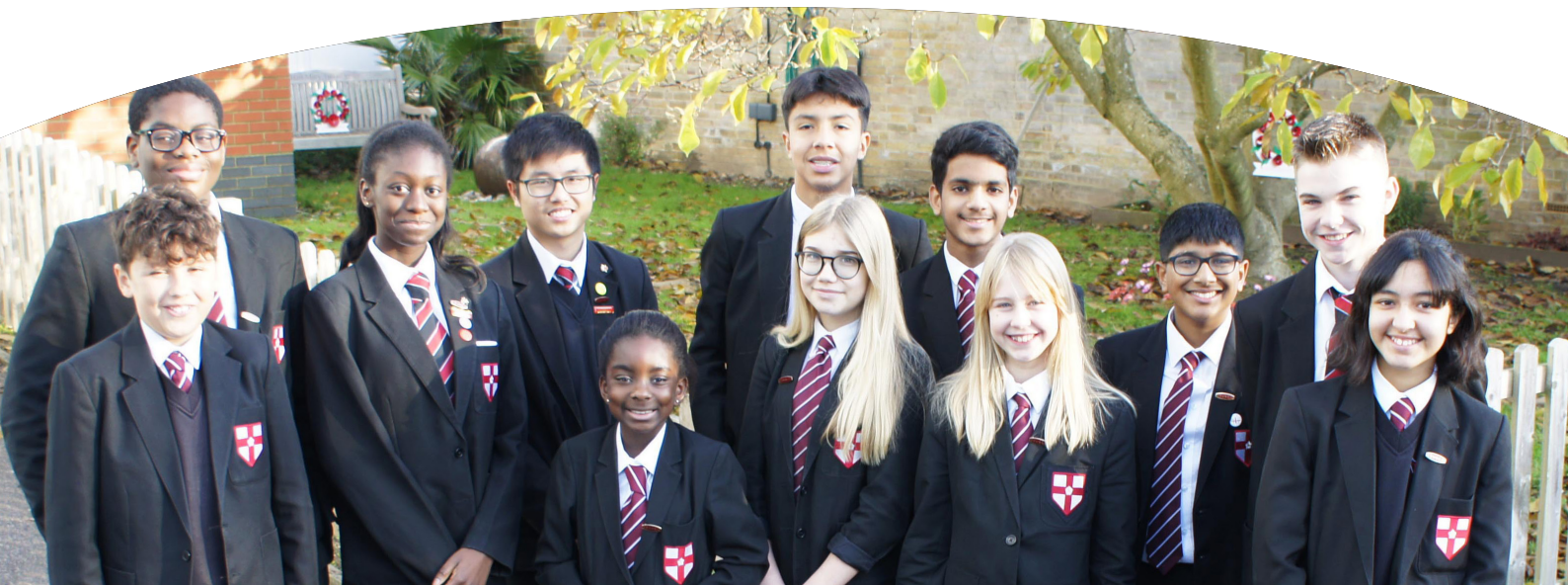
