The First Day

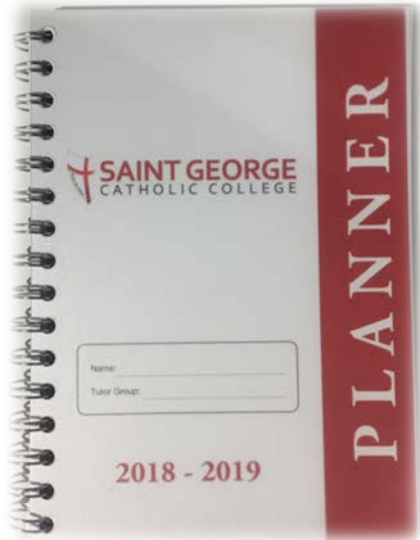
- Please note that due to INSET days, the first day of term for Year 7 is Thursday 3rd September. All other year groups return on Friday 4th September.
- The first day will be a normal school day for our new Year 7 cohort from 8.30am-3pm, they will attend some of their lessons and will spend time getting to know their new tutor group.
- Please be aware that our school buses do not run on this Year 7 only day.
- We are also currently in the middle of some building work, so our entry/reception area may look different, but we will ensure there are clear signs and teachers present to direct the students.

Tutor-time and Assemblies

- Tutor groups meet for 30 minutes a day
- Tutor-time begins at 8.30am and ends at 9am
 - Each day will have an activity or topic for students to work on
- Tutor-time generally has a relaxed and comfortable feel to start the day
 - There are daily prayers and reflection, led by tutors and by students
 - There is a rota for tutor-time visits to the Chapel
 - Assemblies bring together the whole year group and are held weekly. They include prayer, songs of praise, scripture teaching and reflection as well as key messages
 - For Year 7, assembly is held on a Wednesday
- Assemblies are usually led by the progress leader, our college chaplain or the chaplaincy team, and members of the senior leadership team. There are also student-led assemblies throughout the year.



Planners



One of the activities completed by tutors is checking planners.

We ask that planners are signed by you and by your child's tutor at the end of each half term as a means of ongoing communication between home and school.

It is a way of monitoring the amount of homework that is set (and/or any break time and lunchtime detentions that are issued – although we hope there won't be any of those!)

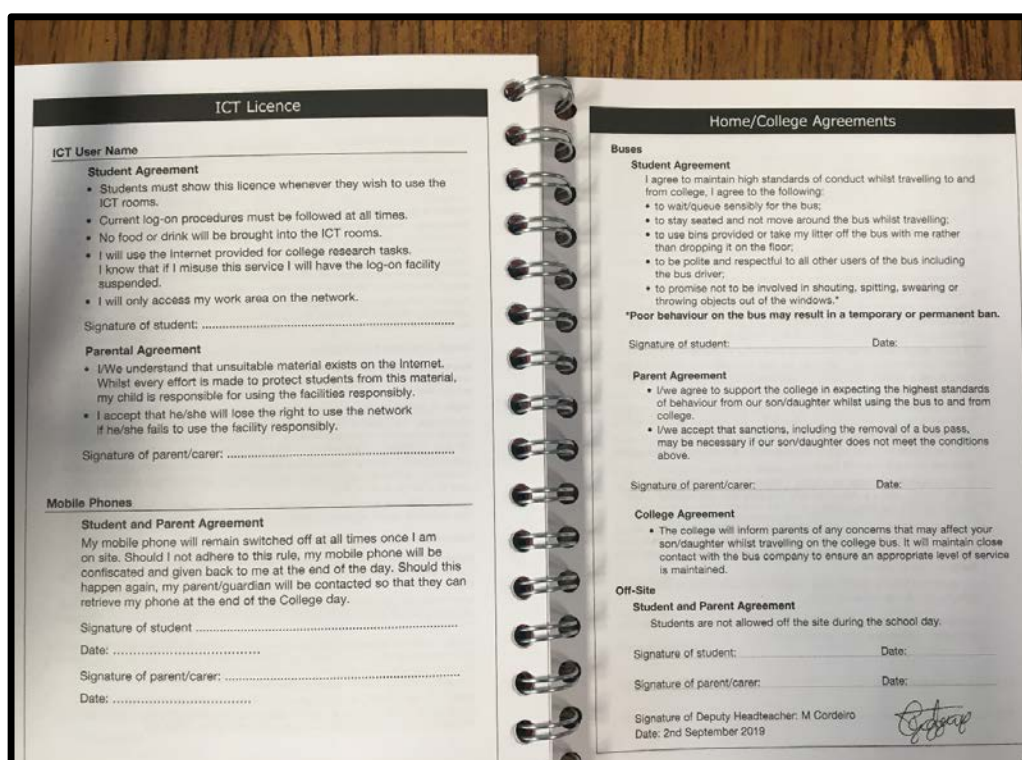
It is a basic expectation that students record their homework and detentions on a day-by-day basis.

PSHE

PSHE (Personal, Social and Health Education) is an essential part of the National Curriculum and is key to young people making responsible and well-informed decisions about their lives.

The PSHE curriculum we deliver is strongly linked to the social, moral, spiritual and cultural ethos of the college, and taught in line with the Catholic faith.

Topics covered in Year 7 include: social media, internet safety, health and wellbeing, and growing up.

The PSHE curriculum is shared on our website (see Parent Area / Teaching and Learning / Subjects).

Students have one lesson of PSHE a week on a rolling programme – for example, in Week 1 it is in P1 on Monday; in Week 2, P2 on Monday; Week 3, p3 on Monday, and so on.

PSHE lessons are usually taught by the tutor. Sometimes outside expert speakers deliver sessions, occasionally a senior member of staff may lead a lesson, and there are times when the whole year group is brought together for PSHE.



Trinity

Trinity is our support and inclusion center.

It is used primarily for student support, and is an environment where pupils feel safe to come and talk to staff.

Attendance

We expect your child's attendance to be as close to 100% as possible, however, we do understand that sometimes students become ill or have appointments / life events that cannot be missed.

In the event of your child being ill or away from school, you must:

- Call in that morning via the absence line (**02380 670102**) and report that your child is off school
- Support the non-attendance by providing the school with evidence (such as a doctor's note) so that we can authorise the absence
- Continue to call in every day that your child is not in school.

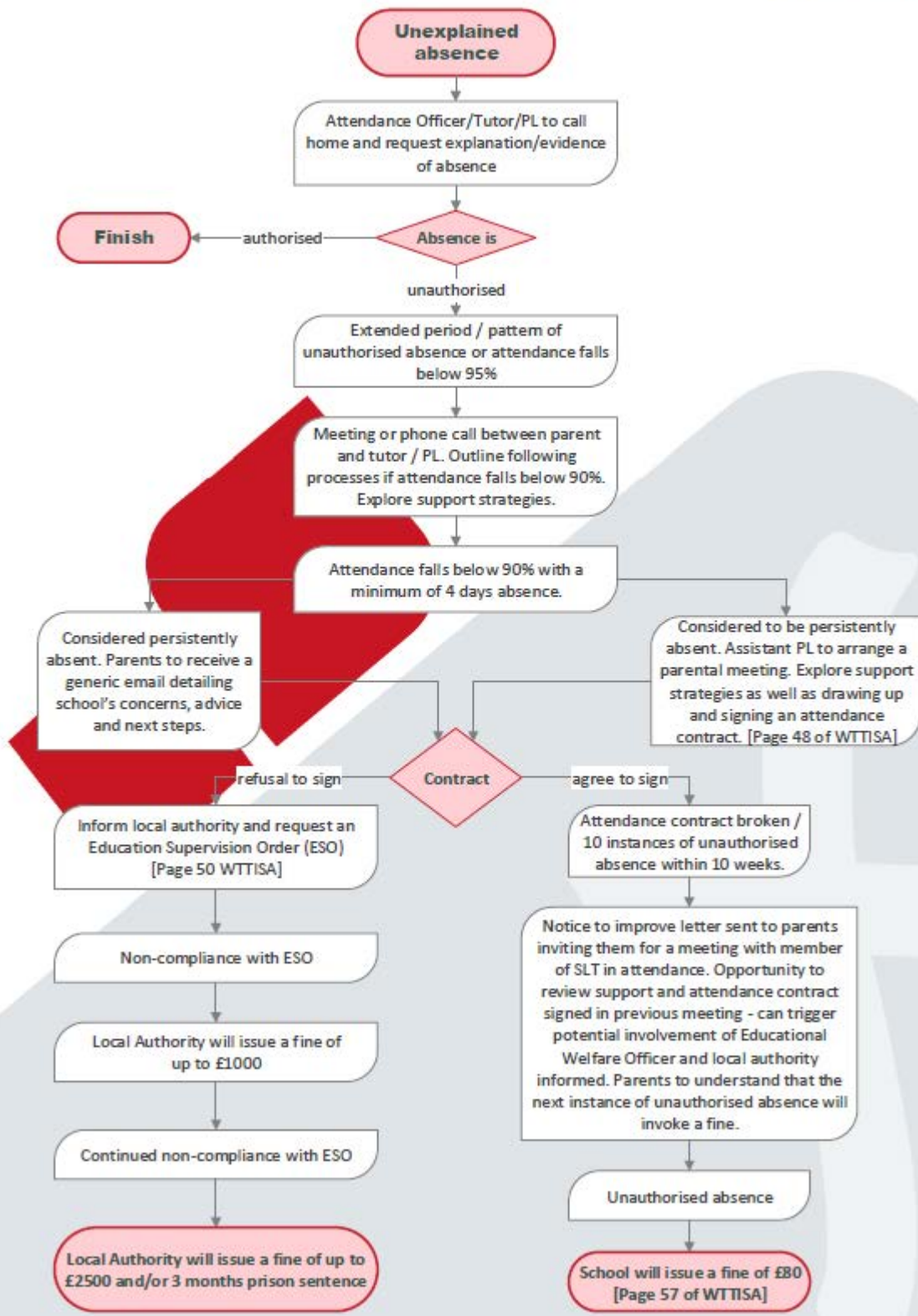
Holidays during term time will not be permitted or authorised unless a pupil has exceptional circumstances, for example, a bereavement.

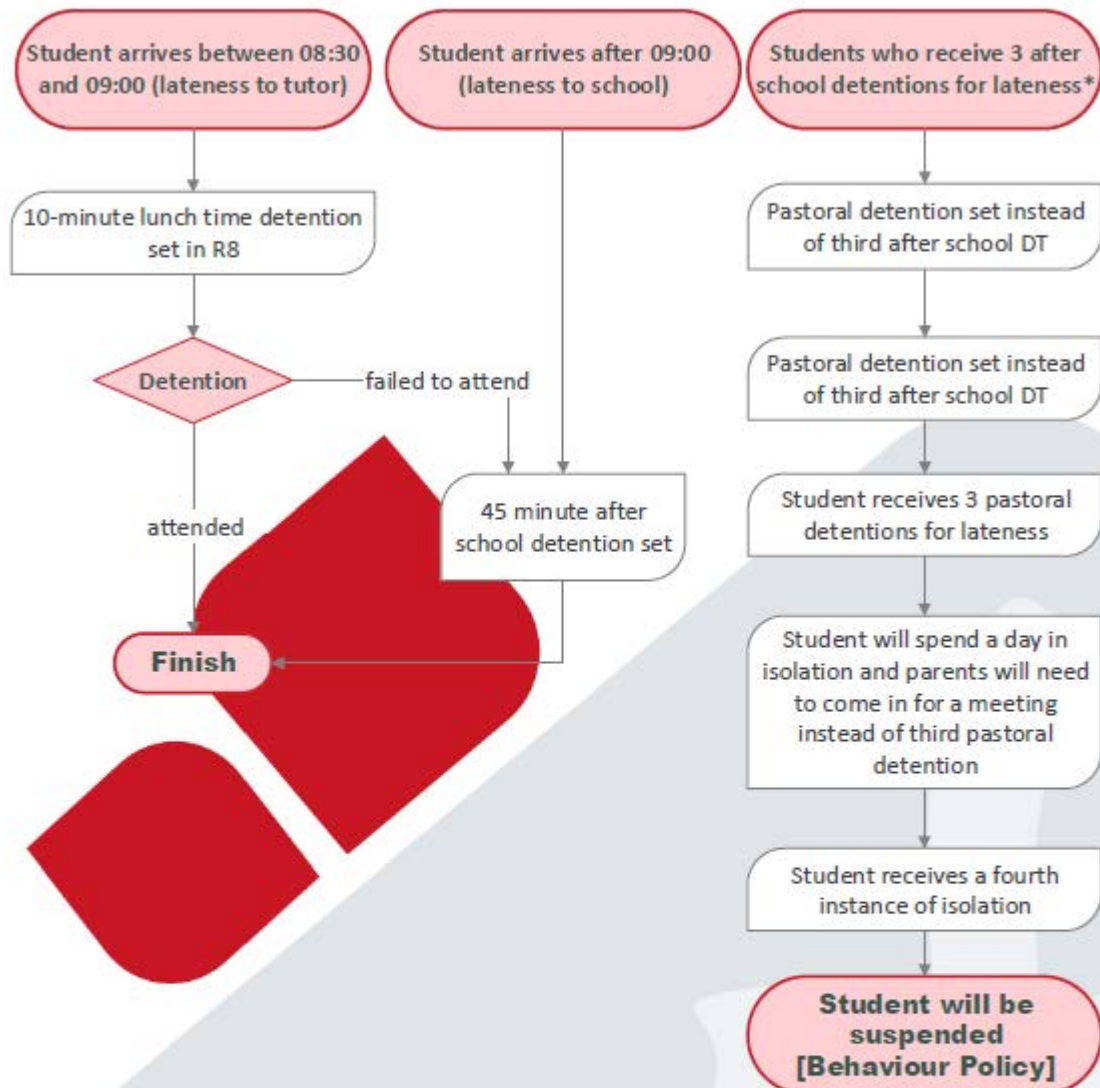
If there is ever a situation where your child needs time off, please either contact Sally Odam, or ask your child to collect a holiday form from the attendance office.

Punctuality is an important part of self-discipline and is essential to good time management. We ask that students are consistently in for 8.30am

If your child is not in school and we do not receive a call, you will receive one of our daily truancy calls.

Failure to do so will mean the absence will be unauthorised – which the college has a duty to report to the local authorities.

Uniform

At Saint George, we believe that a smart school uniform prepares students to develop a sense of professional dress, which is expected in working environments during adulthood. We expect our students to wear their uniform with dignity and respect. Saint George Catholic College has a non-gender-specific uniform. The uniform must be worn smartly, with shirts tucked in and ties done up properly. All shoes/trainers must be black, with no patterns or coloured details. Hoodies / hooded sweaters are not permitted, and outdoor clothing should be removed once inside the classroom.

Winter Uniform – September-Easter (All Items Below Are Compulsory):

- Black blazer with college badge (can be purchased separately or together; badges available from Saint George)
- White shirt
- Red and white Saint George Catholic College tie
- Black straight trousers (no jeans, chinos, tight-fitting, or flared trousers)
- Black pleated skirt, close to the knee (no more than 5cm above the knee), not rolled up. No other skirt styles are allowed.
- All-black shoes/all-black trainers (no knee-high boots)
- Black/grey/white ankle-length socks
- Plain black/tan tights



Summer Uniform (All Items Below Are Compulsory)

- White polo shirt with college logo
- Black straight trousers (no jeans, chinos, tight-fitting, or flared trousers)
- Black pleated skirt, close to the knee (no more than 5cm above the knee), not rolled up. No other skirt styles are allowed.
- All-black shoes/all-black trainers (no knee-high boots)
- Black/grey/white ankle-length socks
- Plain black/tan tights

Optional Items (For Both Summer and Winter Uniforms):

- Black tailored shorts
- Black V-neck jumper with college logo

Winter and summer uniforms must not be mixed.

Physical Education (PE) Uniform:

Indoor / Summer PE:

- Red shorts, white socks, trainers (non-marking soles) – **compulsory**
- White polo shirt with St. George logo – *optional*
- Alternatively, a plain white polo shirt without a logo is allowed.

Outdoor / Winter PE:

- Red shorts, red socks, football boots/trainers, gum shield, shin pads – **compulsory**
- Red long-sleeved rugby top with college logo – *optional*
- Alternatively, a plain red rugby top without a logo is allowed.
- Black tracksuit bottoms or thick black leggings (for Year 10 & 11 girls) – *optional*
- During winter, the Saint George school jumper may be worn as an over-layer (no coats allowed). Thermals are encouraged under the rugby top but must not be visible.
- All items should be clearly labelled.
- *Recommended additional items:* College fleece top, deodorant, towel, and a change of shoes.

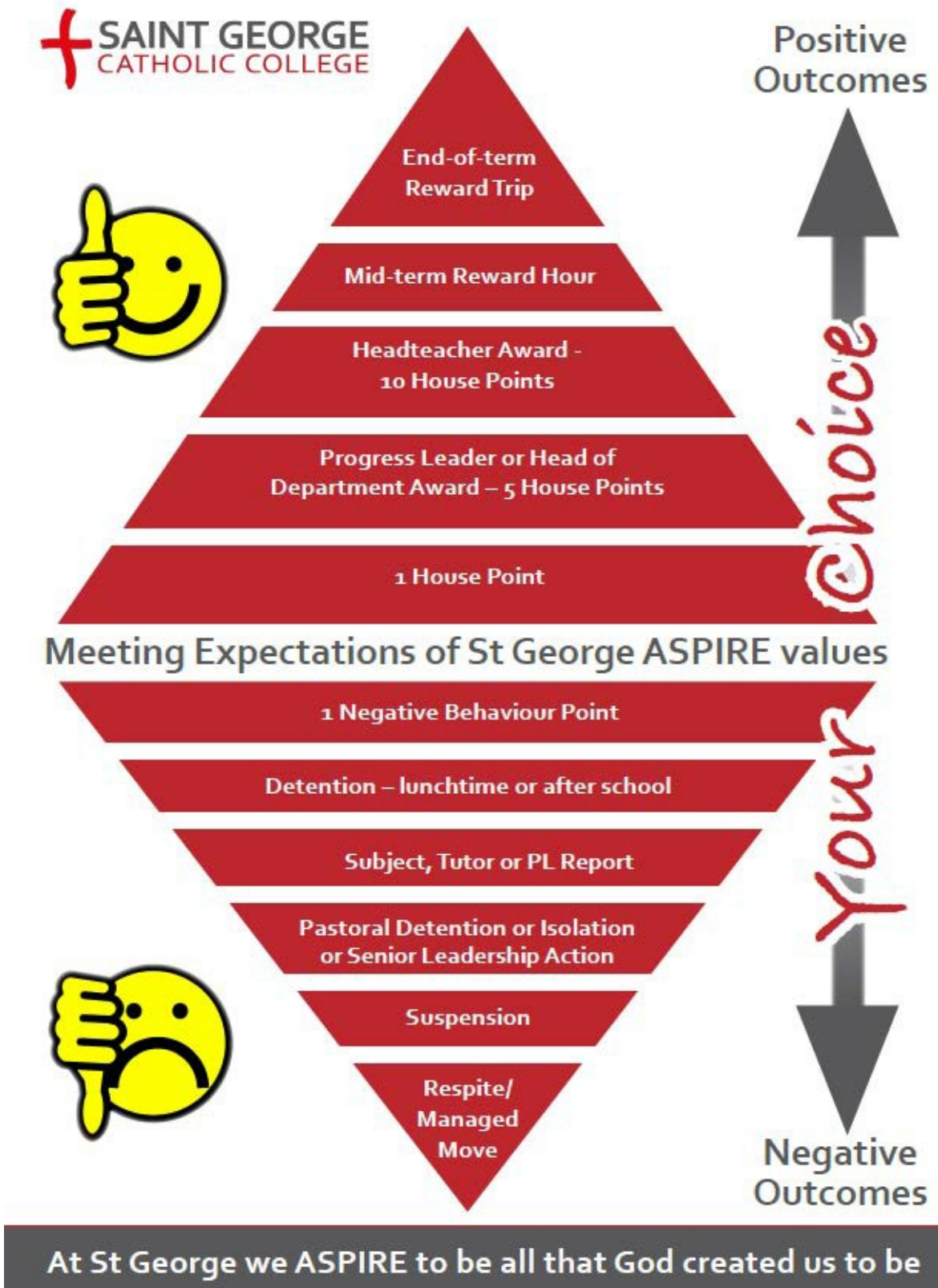

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Year 7 Homework

St George is adopting a phased introduction to homework in Year 7. This approach is designed to support students as they settle into life at their new secondary school, while also developing their independent learning and organisational skills.

Year 7 Phased Introduction to Homework




- **September:** English, RE, Geography, History and Creative Arts
- **October:** Maths & Science
- **November:** Languages and Computer Science

Homework is not set for Performing Arts or PE in Years 7 and 8; however, students are encouraged to participate in the many lunchtime and after-school clubs on offer to further develop their skills in these subjects.


Clubs

- We have a huge variety of lunchtime and afterschool clubs for students. The expectation is that Year 7s join at least one club for half a term (either at lunch and/or afterschool. Please note, we are not able to provide transport home after our evening clubs, which finish at 4pm.

Lockers

- There are 200 lockers so all Year 7 students should have an opportunity to secure one
 - Deposits of £10 are required
 - If the key is lost, £5 of your deposit will be used to replace this
- The locker agreement in your child's planner must be signed even if they don't have a locker – this is to prevent vandalism
- Your child is advised to keep their locker key on a keyring or ribbon to ensure it stays safe
- Lockers are located at various sites around school. Where possible, lockers will be allocated close to your child's tutor base.
- Students will get more information about this at the start of Year 7.



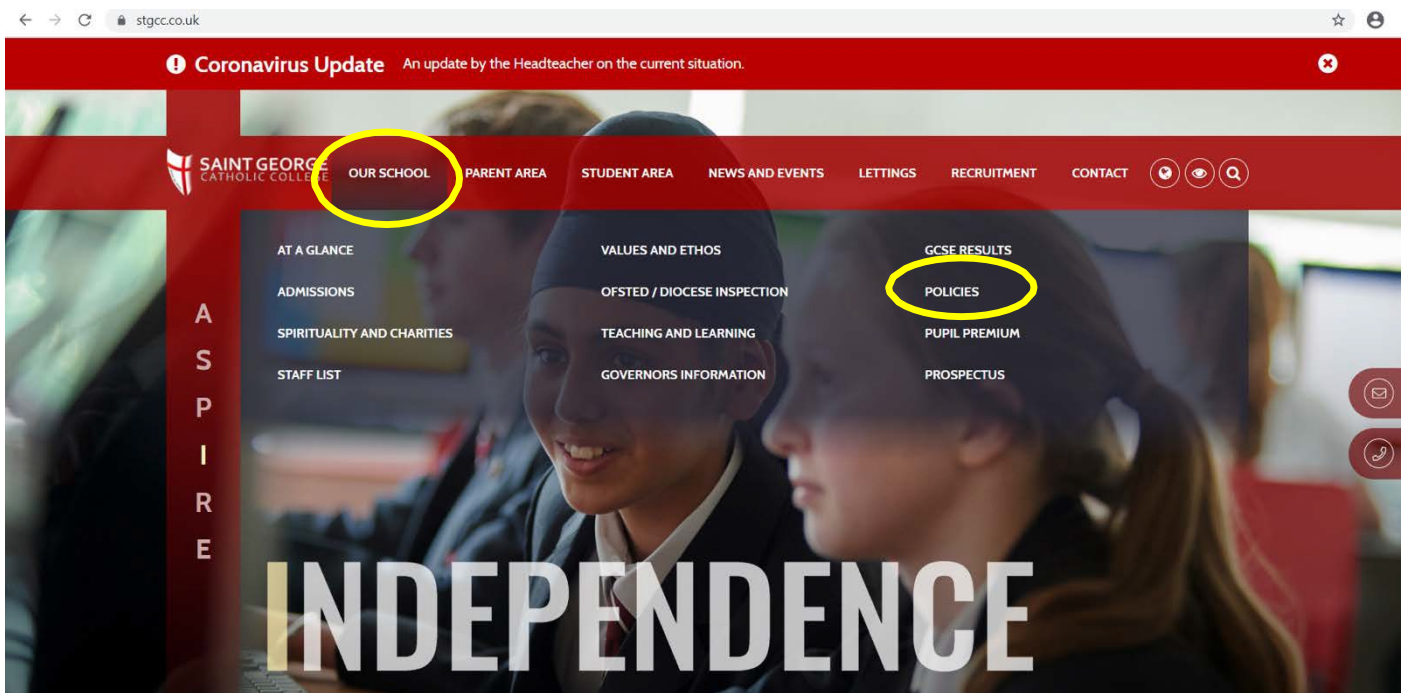
Buses

Question:

Pupils are welcome on site from 8am.
If students arrive early, they are advised to base themselves in the canteen or Trinity.
The canteen serves breakfast from 8.15am.
Everyone must be in for 8.30am

Trinity is also open until 4pm most evenings.
After-school clubs may be available – check the programme on the website.
Students may wait in reception or in the canteen.
Reception is not staffed after 4.30pm.

Question: Are students managed when exiting the site at the end of the school day?

Staff help supervise the children on and off site to ease the flow of students as they leave school.

There is always a member of staff on the school gate, and two members of staff by the buses at the end of the driveway.

Members of the senior leadership team also walk down to the crossing at the end of Leaside Way to manage the safety of our pupils.

Issues are extremely rare and managed quickly and effectively by the pastoral team if they arise.

Year 7s have their own canteen area in the main hall and designated outdoor space on our Multi-Use Games Area.

These areas are supervised by staff at break and lunchtimes so your child will be safe and secure with a choice of both indoor and outdoor space.

Question: Is my child going to be safe during lunch time and break time?

Question: What if my child misses the bus home?

The buses won't depart until 3.10pm. This offers plenty of time for our students to move from the school site up to the bus stops at the end of the school day.

If a student misses the bus due to a fault that isn't their own (i.e. kept behind, or lost something) we will contact you straight away and look to find a way to bring the student home (usually establishment minibuses).

If the student misses the bus due to a fault of their own (i.e. poor time management) then we will contact you straight away and look to arrange a time for you to pick them up. We will keep them on school site and supervised until you arrive.

In this situation we will always look to contact you and give you 24 hours' notice of the after-school detention.

Getting the school bus is not a reason to not do after-school detentions, but we will look to work with you to come to a solution that works for all.

We will seek to arrange a time where you can pick your child up after their detention, or, will keep them on site and supervised until you can arrange transport home for them.

We encourage all of our students to travel to school in an environmentally friendly way.

If your child rides a bike and or scooter to school, then helmets are compulsory. Bikes/scooters will be taken if they ride to school without a helmet.

We also deliver regular tutor sessions and assemblies on road safety where we address the issue of cycle safety and using the roads correctly.

Our cyclists are exceptionally sensible and incidents are extremely rare.

There are secure bike locks at the back of the all-weather pitch.

Bikes are not permitted in the school buildings or the playground.

Concern: My child doesn't know anyone in their tutor group or classes...

Although we want your child to feel settled here, our priority is with your child's learning, progress and development.

The students will find they will be in different classes depending on their ability, and banded into an 'A' side of the year group and a 'B' side of the year group depending on language study.

Students only spend 30 minutes a day in tutor groups – these are not groups they are with for all lessons. Students have been placed based on information we received from their primary school prior to them starting at St George.

Question: What extra-curricular clubs are there?

There are lots of extra-curricular clubs and activities that run during lunchtime or after school and all Year 7s are expected to participate in at least one a week.

Full details of the programme will be shared with your child on their first day with us and can also be found on our website.

Extra-curricular clubs typically run between 3pm and 4pm. PE fixtures and clubs will have a later finish. Students attending extra-curricular clubs will need to arrange their own transport home after the club.

Question: What time do extra-curricular clubs run?

Concern: What if my child doesn't feel well at school.

For head colds or tummy aches etc, we encourage you to send your child into school even if they feel slightly unwell. If their condition does not improve throughout the day, your child can go to first aid and our school nurse or one of our qualified first aiders will make an informed decision on whether they need to go home or should go back to lessons.

In the event that we think they need to be sent home, you will be contacted immediately to arrange the collection of your child.

Trinity has some laptops and devices for typing, or can offer some form of curriculum support so that disruption to learning is minimised.

In some cases, such as broken legs, work is often brought over to Trinity for the student to complete with Teaching Assistant support.

If your child has an injury, please notify us so that we can put the necessary provision in place.

Concern:
My child takes medication during the day

Students must NOT carry or administer any medication themselves while at school. The exception is when a student needs to carry an inhaler/epi-pen. If this is the case, the college needs to have been notified by a signed/dated letter from you as their parent or guardian.

You must provide a letter for any medication brought into the college. This should be handed in to the first aid room, stating the dosage and when the medication needs to be taken during school hours.

We have a team of staff trained to support students, led by our Designated Safeguarding Lead Miss Cordeiro.

Children can visit Trinity, where they can have an informal chat or – if necessary – a referral to our ELSA or Mental Health Nurse.

Our website has advice for students and parents, and we have a designated email, only for children, if they are feeling concerned for their safety, well-being or have anxiety which is affecting their ability to function as they normally would: staysafe@stgcc.co.uk

Mobile phones are not allowed to be used during school hours or on school site. Students are allowed to carry their mobile phones switched off or in their bags.

If we have concerns about your child, or they need to contact you, we have a phone in reception or in the Progress Leaders' office that your child can use to contact you.

The mobile phone policy was introduced for a number of reasons, one of them being the increasing number of incidents to do with social media.

Social media should be regulated by you, the parents – but at school we will provide an education into the risks of social media and how to operate social media safely and appropriately.
